Thank you for your information request, received on 21 March 2025.

You requested the following information:

Since 2020 How much money has Islington Council raised from penalty charge notice relating to driving infringements in:

1. Low Traffic Neighbourhoods
2. People friendly streets
3. Liveable neighbourhoods
4. School streets

How has the money been spent from these PCNs?

Response: People Friendly Streets is the name of the programme under which Low Traffic Neighbourhood (LTN) and School Street restrictions have been introduced. LTNs were not introduced until the 2020/21 financial year. Please note that implementation of Islington's proposed Liveable Neighbourhoods has not yet been completed and so there is no PCN data for these.

Income received from all penalty charges, not just LTN and School Street scheme related PCNs, is paid into a Ring-fenced Parking Account ("RPA"), to comply with section 55(1) Road Traffic Regulation Act (RTRA) 1984. Any surplus is appropriated into the Council's General Fund at the year end.

The Council's expenditure from the General Fund includes expenditure on areas such as highways investment, roads and footways, highways maintenance, environmental improvements, concessionary fares and transport for pupils with special educational needs. Total expenditure on these areas has consistently been greater than the surplus generated on the RPA.
